#### Green Schools News:

We are currently renewing our energy saving programme in Ballina school. The committee and pupils are monitoring energy use and making sure lights and interactive boards are switched off when not needed.

We hope to plant some flowers and plants in the coming weeks. If anyone wishes to donate seeds or plants to the school they would be greatly appreciated.

### Science News:

As a part of our school's application for a Gold Curious Minds Award for Science we are running an engineering competition for 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> classes. The competition is voluntary and will be completed outside of the classroom. Pupils bring in their creation on the appointed day and we will test them all.

In order to enter the competition pupils will need to design and build a car-like machine that can travel for at least five metres in a straight line. It must be capable of carrying an object (a golf ball) without it falling off. The ball will be supplied on the day.

What the device looks like and is made of is up to each individual. However, a shop-bought kit is not permitted. The device must be homemade (although you may use motors, batteries, Lego, recycled materials and other little components that may be lying around). The first week of March (Engineer's Week) is the deadline. Family members are allowed to help. Projects can be worked on individually or in groups no larger than two. Best of luck to everyone.
